Requires the AHCA, in consultation with the DOH, APD, DCF, and DOC, to competively procure a contract with a vendor to negotiate prices for prescriptions drugs, inlcuding insulin and epinephrine, for all particpating agencies. The contract must require that the vendor be compensated on a contingency basis paid from a portion of the savings achieved through the negotiation and purchase of prescription drugs.	Different	House Modified	In order to implement Specific Appropriations (xxx) of the 2022-2023 General Appropriations Act, the Agency for Health Care Administration, in consultation with the Department of Health, the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, the Department of Children and Families, and the Department of Corrections, shall competitively procure a contract with a vendor to negotiate, for these agencies, prices for prescribed drugs and biological products excluded from the program established under s. 381.02035, F.S., and ineligible under Title 21 U.S.C. sec. 384, including but not limited to, insulin and epinephrine. The contract may allow the vendor to directly purchase these products for participating agencies when feasible and advantageous. The contracted vendor will be compensated on a contingency basis, paid from a portion of the savings achieved by its price negotiation or purchase of the prescription drugs and products.
