CS/CS/HB 1285  The bill repeals the Florida State Guard's expiration date, making it a permanent component of the state militia. The bill revises the structure of the FSG by creating a Division of the State Guard (Division) within the Department of Military Affairs as a separate budget entity, headed by a director who is appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. The bill also transfers administrative duties and powers from the Adjutant General to the director. The bill requires the director to organize a specialized unit within the FSG and requires specified members of the unit to meet certain minimum requirements.				82
