Fire Station 58 was originally constructed in 1974 by the members of the former volunteer Margate Fire Department. As the current Fire Station is over 40 years old, funding would provide for construction of a new station. The City is currently in the design phase of this project. A new fire station will greatly reduce the city's current costs to maintain and repair its existing fire station that is in various stages of disrepair. d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

<u>Residents and businesses rely on fire rescue services to keep them safe. A new and modern station will be a better designed and configured facility. This may result in improved response times. Furthermore, an improved and upgraded City facility will result in more community pride in the services the City offers. The new Fire Station will also include a community room that civic associations and other interest groups would be able to use for various meetings and events.</u>

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Fire Rescue Station 58 is part of the Margate-Coconut Creek Fire Rescue Department. The total combined population of the City of Margate and City of Coconut Creek exceeds 110,000. This particular fire station provides fire and emergency services to at least one-third of the population of the City of Margate, equating to approximately 18,000 residents as well as provides automatic aid response to the City of Coral Springs. The station also serves as a Safe Haven for unwanted newborns and also as a Safe Place for adolescents in distress.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

<u>The expected benefit is a new Fire Station that provides a safer environment for firefighter/paramedics</u> <u>through a better designed and configured facility and improved technologies that will result in better</u> <u>preservation of expensive and essential equipment and significantly less maintenance costs. This will be</u> <u>measured by looking at measures such as improved response time and lower maintenance costs as a</u> <u>comparison between current figures and post-construction figures.</u>
