d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

<u>The purpose of the requested funding is for the construction of a much needed City of Naples emergency</u> <u>services infrastructure, including an Emergency Operations Center in a secure Category 5 building. This will</u> <u>enable the Fire-Rescue Department to provide services to the citizens and tourists of the City of Naples</u> <u>regardless of how harsh the weather may become. In the most severe circumstances, the new building will</u> <u>enable Fire-Rescue personnel to provide response and support directly after a major storm passes. The new</u> <u>building will also house Fire-Rescue Administration, Operations, Prevention, and Training and will serve the</u> <u>citizens of Naples each day. Recognizing that the City of Naples has limited secure infrastructure, the design of</u> <u>the new facility features secured space for City of Naples Building Department and Technology Services</u> <u>documents and critical technology hardware.</u>

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Citizens, Residents, Tourist and visitors to the City of Naples and Collier County

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

<u>The construction of the new facility will benefit the community by enhancing service for the residents and</u> visitors of the City of Naples. Improved response times will clearly be produced by the implementation of new technology in dispatching and alerting, as well as the ability to provide rapid service to the community after any major incident or storm. The Fire-Rescue Department will use data from response times to demonstrate a positive outcome and the ability to quickly respond to medical and fire emergencies directly after a major hurricane or storm event as well as the secure command and control functions from the Emergency Operations <u>Center.</u>
