- 4. Project/Program Description:

Last year, the City of Riviera Beach launched the Summer Youth Employment and Job Training Program. The program is open to youth age 14-21 who reside in the City of Riviera Beach. The program is focused but not limited to youth who reside in the City of Riviera Beach who meet Temporary Assistance for Needy for Families (TANF) guidelines, as well as federal, state, and local low to moderate income eligibility guidelines. The program is divided into two segments and offers an eight week Summer Leadership Camp and an eight week paid Summer Internship Employment Program. The Summer Leadership Camp provides training to young people as well as educational stipends to students who successfully complete the program. The Summer Intership Prgram places young people age 16-21 in external paid interships. The goal of the program is to provide summer employment and training opportunities to youth in businesses and organizations.
