The three specific goals that will be achieved with this funding request are to: improve physical health, improve mental health, and improve the quality of education for children with developmental disabilities.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Improving Physical Health: Infants and toddlers are provided therapeutic and nursing services. A full time LPN helps students with severe health needs Improve their gross motor skills, physical agility and school attendance. Improving Mental Health: Children ages 0-3 will experience improvement in cognitive functioning and ability to socially interact and communicate with others. Improving the Quality of Education: Providing educational and therapeutic intervention at an early age to a child with developmental disabilities gives them the chance to increase their abilities while building independence. Each child will undergo a Baseline test and the progress of each child is assessed and tracked routinely with additional testing throughout the duration of the child's participation in the program.

<u>A comprehensive academic curriculum, therapies, nutritional services, nursing and social services. Specialized</u> <u>services and supports, such as physical therapy, speech and language therapy, respiratory therapy, and</u> <u>behavioral analyst services, specialized instruction, home visits, family support, and service coordination.</u>

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

<u>The project serves preschool students with developmental disabilities and those who are at risk for</u> <u>developmental disabilities in Broward County and surrounding areas. These children typically derive from</u> <u>economically disadvantaged family situations with compounding poor mental and physical health. 25-50</u> <u>individuals are expected to be served.</u>

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

<u>The goal of Ann Storck Center's program is to provide early intervention services that include a comprehensive</u> academic curriculum, therapies, nutritional services, nursing services and social services. Specialized services and supports, such as physical therapy, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, behavior analytics, special instruction, home visits, family support, and service coordination, increase the potential for a child to develop to his or her full potential. By providing these comprehensive services, Ann Storck Center's Early



Intervention Program ensures that each child is taught at his or her own skill level. The overall long-term outcome is that, upon the child graduating from the Preschool at age five, he or she is placed in an optimum education level and setting. The main goal of Ann Storck Center's Preschool Program is to develop and build upon these abilities, allowing each child the opportunity to work towards functioning as independently as possible.
