- 4. Project/Program Description:

Specialized Treatment Education and Prevention Services (STEPS), Inc, will provide level II residential treatment with a combination of medication assisted treatment (MAT) for opiate addiction to Women with children, Women, Pregnant or post-partum and who are residents of Brevard County where no residential level II treatment beds exist. Increasingly, women from Brevard County are being admitted into treatment from local jails, emergency rooms and detox facilities. Many are pregnant, homeless, or a victims of trauma. Effective treatment at the STEPS residential program will also provide a broad array of services that will address the unique women's needs such as, pregnancy, parenting, mental health, life skills, education and vocational services. Twenty-three (23) percent of babies born in Brevard County in 2015 were born with Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS).

#### **11.** Program Performance:

#### a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose and goal is to provide Residential level II treatment beds and the availability of Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) and evidenced based treatment services comprised of group, individual and family counseling that currently do not exist in Brevard County. Services will be provided to Women, Women with Child(ren), Pregnant and post-partum women who are residents of Brevard County. Provision of this treatment is aimed to keep the mother and child(ren) together, decrease dependency, decrease recidivism, increase positive birth outcomes, eliminate pre-natal drug exposure, and increase family reunification. Additionally, STEPS treatment will ease other financial burdens to Brevard County such as a reduction in costs associated with emergency room visits, jail time and foster care. The evidenced-based treatment provided is consistent with current research and knowledge to increase the likelihood that participants will complete treatment and achieve recovery.

#### b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

In addition to Residential level II treatment beds and the availability of Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) to all participants, a client-centered approach will be delivered through group therapy, and individual and family counseling to address individualized needs and substance use disorders including parenting, family dysfunction, relationships or trauma. Through established Memorandum of Agreements (MOA), STEPS will link



all participant's to additional services unique to women's needs with community providers such as health care, pre and post-natal care, employment, education, childcare and housing. Upon completion of the residential program, participants will be transitioned back to Brevard County into one of our outpatient programs to receive after care and follow up services. Transportation will also be provided to and from treatment and to all appointments including visitation with children in dependency care.

# d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

<u>Funds for this project will provide ten (10) residential level II treatment beds, evidenced based group and</u> <u>individual counseling, transportation and Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) to Women with children,</u> <u>Women, Pregnant and post partum women who are addicted to opiates residing in Brevard County.</u>

#### e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



<u>Based on the length of stay in the program with the average being six (6) months funding for ten (10) beds will</u> serve twenty (20) Women with children, Women and Pregnant and post partum women experiencing opiate addiction in Brevard County.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

<u>Program results and outcomes will be measured as follows: (1) 75% of program participants will successfully</u> <u>complete treatment as evidenced by documentation in the discharge summary; (2) 75% of program</u> <u>participants will increase access to safe and sober housing as evidenced by documentation in the transition</u> <u>plan and discharge summary. (3) 75% of program participants will achieve reunification with their child(ren) as</u> <u>evidenced by documentation in child welfare case plans, the transition plan and discharge summary. (4) 75% of</u> <u>program participants will improve their probation outcome as evidenced by documentation in probation</u> <u>reports, the transition plan and discharge summary.</u>
