- 4. Project/Program Description:

In 2000, the Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea annexed several areas into its corporate boundary through resident referendum; residents voted to become part of the Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea over the City of Pompano and Fort Lauderdale. One of the annexed neighborhoods is located next to the Intracoastal Waterway and the Atlantic Ocean, and consists of 99 single family homes. These homes abutting the Intracoastal Waterway are the last homes in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea on septic tanks which are poorly maintained and failing. In an effort to protect the residents and the environment from potential contamination of the waterway, the Town Commission ranked the conversion of septic tanks to a sewer system as a priority. Furthermore, the Town has partnered with the City of Pompano Beach on the project and will transfer the system to its Utility Department upon completion of the construction work to assume operation.

Since the septic tanks in the target area are poorly maintained, the goal of the sewer system project is to protect Town residents and users of the waterway by reducing the amount of nutrients loading into the ground, eliminating bacteria contamination of the Intracoastal Waterway, and preventing nutrient-related impairment to the water body.

As part of the Town's multijurisdictional approach, the City of Pompano Beach will work in partnership with the Town on the development of the sewer system and assure operation of the system once constructed.
