The Talleyrand Connector will remove obstacles to the movement of goods in Northeast Florida's international gateway to trade. venues. Jacksonville also serves as a logistics hub and gateway to the southeastern United States, and this
project will improve freight flow at this location which benefits freight traveling to, from, and through northeast
Florida to and from the southeastern United States and internationally via the Talleyrand Port District at the
Port of Jacksonville

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improving freight flow and accessibility to the Talleyrand Port District, will provide safety and way-finding improvements for freight turning; relieve congestion along Hart Expressway during the AM and PM peak periods, while preserving north Florida's working waterfronts dependent on deep water, rail and highway access. Additionally it will protect waterborne trade and intermodal freight movement, support opportunities for port redevelopment and expansion by enhancing infrastructure, freight flow and improve connectivity to downtown Jacksonville.
