1. Title of Project: Blind Babies Successful Transition from Preschool to School

4. Project/Program Description:

Blind Babies program is provided year-round by 14 non-profit members of Florida Association of Agencies Serving the Blind. Services prepare blind/visually impaired babies, ages birth to 5, to use all their senses including any remaining vision, to maximize child development stages and enter kindergarten ready to learn. Parents find the support they need. Specialists who come to their homes and/or serve their children at the agencies' facilities. This request seeks a rate increase from \$3,000 to \$5,160/baby, more in line with actual costs of year-round service. Increased funding is requested from new sources in order to preserve the DBS match for Federal dollars for blind working age and seniors. About half of the babies reaching age 5 each year cannot be served in the Children's Program because fewer children are funded than babies. This request is synchronized with a separate request for the Children's Program of Florida Association of Agencies Serving the Blind.

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Blind Babies Program goals are to assist blind babies to attain developmental milestones and be ready for kindergarten. Blind Babies attaining age 5 will be able to progress into the Blind Children's Program.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Play therapy to increase abilities across 8 primary skill areas: Cognitive, Language, Vision, Compensatory, Socialization, Self-Help and Fine and Gross Motor Skills. Certified or licensed instructors use toys that can be manipulated, that make sounds and/or light up and also use iPad games to encourage babies/toddlers to reach, grasp, learn cause and effect, use any remaining vision as well as other senses, sit up, crawl and walk, eat and dress at appropriate age level, understand the concepts of up/down/behind/in front of/under/over, across, etc. which are essential to future safe travel instruction, self-care skills, and educational success.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Instruction in the family home or at the agencies' facilities by visually impaired babies/toddlers in specific skills to compensate for effects of blindness on reaching developmental milestones. Babies/toddlers will be ready for academic achievement upon entering kindergarten. Parents will be confident and capable of rearing their blind children.

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- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

 475 blind babies in the State of Florida and their parents/primary caregivers.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Age-appropriate developmental gains (babies) and acquisition of social and pre-vocational skills. Assessment through Pre and Post tests normed for blind babies in the 8 primary skill areas (See b. above).

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Penalties for failure to meet deliverables (hours of service and number of children served) are meted out by reducing payments. In previous years, all deliverables have been met.
