- 1. Title of Project: South Daytona Septic to Sewer Conversion Project

- 4. Project/Program Description:

The South Daytona Septic to Sewer Conversion Project involves connecting those properties still utilizing a septic tank sewage disposal system to municipal sewer where available. There are a total of 224 such properties within South Daytona. Of those properties, 171 have voluntarily signed up to participate in this project. Construction activities in Phase I are scheduled to being in January 2019. Construction activities will involve locating existing septic tank and City sewer service. The septic tank will then be abandoned in place by pumping it out, punching a hole in the bottom to prevent it from floating and filling it full of dirt. The sewage disposal line coming from the home will then be re-routed to the City sewer service located at the front of the property. The removal of septic tank sewage disposal systems within coastal regions greatly benefits the environment by removing nutrients, such as nitrogen, before they are released into nearby water bodies.

It is mutually agreed between the parties hereto that the CONTRACTOR shall pay the OWNER ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) for each consecutive calendar day, including rain days and holidays, that expires after

All milestone completion dates, including substantial and final completion, will be determined solely by the Owner. The OWNER has the option to retain this amount from the compensation otherwise paid to the BIDDER. Should the total amount chargeable as liquidated damages exceed the amount due or payable to the CONTRACTOR or his/her Surety, then such excess shall be paid to the OWNER by the CONTRACTOR or his/her Surety.

The City of South Daytona is the owner of the city sewer lines and will be responsible for connecting the homeowner lines to the city lines.
