11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds to restore support for Writing Center space and staff on all Daytona State Campuses. The Writing Center provides one-on-one free tutoring to all students at Daytona State College for any course. In 2017-2018, Writing Center staff conducted over 4,500 one-on-one tutoring sessions with students and offered 50 different writing workshops. Students spent nearly 27,000 hours at our six campus locations last year.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Success in gateway English composition classes is required to complete an associate's degree at all Florida state colleges, yet this course proves challenging to many students. Failure in this early course can prevent progression in the degree, and often stymies student motivation to proceed as well. Our data show that even one visit to the Writing Center is associated with higher pass rates in gateway English classes, as students get help from professional writing tutors. Not only do we see higher pass rates in courses, but student surveys show significant increases in confidence in writing among students who come to the Writing Center, which aids them in all future classes. Survey data show very high student support for Writing Center services.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The Writing Center provides one-on-one free tutoring to all students at Daytona State College for any course, and offers workshops in many types of writing types. In 2017-2018, Writing Center staff conducted over 4,500 one-on-one tutoring sessions with students and offered 50 different writing workshops. Students spent nearly 27,000 hours at our six campus locations last year.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served? 25,000 students at Daytona State College, including 1200 dual enrolled students.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

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Increase in students completing gateway English (ENC1101), a course required in all AS programs and the AA; Increase in students graduation from college with an AS or AA. All data on gateway English courses is reported to the state for comparison with state targets and other colleges and universities. All graduation rates are reported to the state each semester and are used in tabulating performance measures.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Standard penalties are sufficient.
