\$4M to support the Fort Myers Reentry Initiative (FMRI) to provide permanent employment opportunities, decrease recidivism, reduce crime and improve public safety through community partnerships. Mentors from the community are assigned to each offender to work together on service-based projects. In conjunctions with FMRI, the Public Safety and Beautification Project will provide employment services, career development and job training specifically in property maintenance and landscaping services within the city's jurisdiction.
