a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The objective of the state funding initiative is to support and enhance high quality HIV/AIDS research through pilot grant funds leading to a cure for HIV/AIDS and AIDS vaccine-developments in response to the health needs of Florida's citizens. One of our State pilot awardees, Dr. Ronald C. Desrosiers, just published on a strategy that leads to an AIDS cure. This scientific accomplishment was supported with State of Florida funding and is an important step towards ending the AIDS epidemic.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Support innovative research leading to a cure for HIV/AIDS and AIDS vaccine developments. State funds will be spent on pilot grant projects to allow researchers to develop innovative lines of research and be more competitive for federal grants and support of the research unit at Jackson Memorial Hospital.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Funding supports a research Unit at Jackson Memorial Hospital which facilitates inclusion of underrepresented individuals in clinical research studies that provide access to cutting edge therapies.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

HIV/AIDS infected population in Florida. Over 800 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improved health care outcomes, access to novel medications, and increased support for patients enrolled in clinical studies. Increased participation of minorities in clinical research studies and increase access to cutting-



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edge treatments. An increase in federal grant funding as pilot grants allow researchers to develop innovative lines of research and be more competitive for Federal grants. Currently, for every dollar in State Pilot funding allocated, we are receiving 12 dollars in Federal funding. This is a significant return on investment. State funds also drive innovative and high quality HIV/AIDS research projects aimed at developing a cure for HIV/AIDS as well as an AIDS vaccine-development in response to the health needs of Florida's citizens.
