a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose is to provide an alternate North - South corridor for Ocala traffic west of I-75 that ties to SR 200, SR 40 and US 27 to improve traffic conditions, increase access and mobility for all users, and provide alternative parallel roadway for incidents on I-75.

- b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
 - The activities to be provided include the construction of a four lane roadway with ADA compliant bike lanes and sidewalks for better connectivity, access, and mobility for all users.
- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?
 - Direct services to citizens include increased bicycle and pedestrian travel by providing expanded ADA compliant sidewalks and bike lanes, and improved vehicular access and mobility.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
 - This project will serve the entire city which has a population of approximately 60,000, as well as Marion County and visitors.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
 - Improve physical health by encouraging walking and biking with expanded sidewalks and bike lanes. Reduce vehicular congestion, delays, and travel-time at SR 200, SR 40, US 27, and I-75 in Ocala by providing an alternate North South corridor for Ocala traffic west of I-75 that ties to SR 200, SR 40, and US 27. Method for measuring benefits or outcome is before and after traffic studies and annual traffic & pedestrian counts.
