a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Prepare nursing and healthcare program graduates to meet workforce needs. Increase student capacity in the nursing and health program by providing necessary clinical laboratory equipment, supplies, and software needed for program expansion. Provide funding for faculty development in best practices for healthcare education.

- b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds? Provide qualified healthcare professionals that are critical to the health of the citizens of Central Florida.
- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Increased capacity to deliver more graduates who are prepared to enter the workforce. Filling the gaps in regional and statewide healthcare workforce needs - specific data by occupation is available upon request. Students will benefit from instruction by highly qualified faculty in state-of-the-art clinical laboratories. Citizens will benefit by Seminole State College's ability to contribute to a stronger local, regional, and statewide workforce.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

As consumers of healthcare: Elderly persons, persons with poor physical and/or mental health. As students in the nursing and health programs: Jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, and, high school and college students. The Florida Center for Nursing has estimated that 1,000 new Registered Nurses will be needed in Region 12 in each of the next 10 years. This need is well beyond the current capacity of existing regional training providers and leaves a large gap to be filled. A total of approximately 800 individuals will be served with project funds.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome

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### will be measured?

Expected benefits/outcomes of this project: Provide nursing and health program graduates needed in the workforce to impact the health of Florida citizens. Improved student preparation in nursing, health, and related courses that will feed the pathway into high level STEM occupations in healthcare. The Bureau of Labor Statistics projects that the employment of healthcare occupations is expected to grow 18% from 2016-2026. The Healthcare Career Cluster is expected to be the largest occupational cluster in the United States. Of the ten jobs that the Bureau ranks as the fastest percent of growth in the next decade, five of the careers are in healthcare and elder assistance. Enhancement of students' skill sets will make them more competitive and give them an advantage in the healthcare workforce. For example, a 2017 student by the Rand Corporation found that holding a degree or certificate increases the probability of employment and increases wages for underrepresented groups.
