To provide support for the families of our youth through counseling and community supports.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Provide wrap-around services to program participants. This includes, but is not limited to, individual and group counseling, family counseling, academic tutoring, food, transportation and connection to community supports.

- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?
 - Counseling, mentoring, transportation, meals, tutoring, diversion, GED, vocational and employment coaching.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

 Up to 200 youth ages 14-19 and their families per year.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

75% Increase school participation as evidenced by school records comparing prior participation to current data; Decreased involvement with juvenile justice and law enforcement as evidenced by court and probation data; 60% Increase in number of Drug-Free days as evidenced by self-report, family, and toxicology screening.
