11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Nassau County School District expand apprenticeship opportunities in the region by working directly with the Northeast Florida Builders' Association (NEFBA) to grow program offerings and create a strong pipeline of applicants into various trade professions. The District will assume a Local Education Agency (LEA) relationship with NEFBA.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The District will assist NEFBA to create new programs and grow current ones. The project will allow NEFBA's programs to expand and the district to add new ones. Additional recruitment efforts will assist area employers with finding qualified apprentice candidates and allow high school students greater exposure to careers in building trades.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Apprenticeship training and employment opportunities will be provided to citizens. An enhanced workforce pipeline will be provided to regional contractors.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population of the project will be adults seeking a viable career and the building contractors that would hire them. It is estimated that the project would serve over 200 people in the first year and over 400 people a year within five years.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

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The expected benefit will be increased apprenticeship training in the Northeast Florida region. The success of the project will be measured by the increase in reported enrollment hours in the Nassau County School District's workforce development programs. This data is reported to the Florida Department of Education.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The contract with NEFBA will be paid as work is performed, so if deliverables are not met they will not receive funding.
