This funding will go towards the renovation, design and construction of PARC Children's Autism Classrooms and Therapy Center. 11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The addition of three preschool classrooms and therapy areas specifically designed to meet the needs of children aged 2-5 who are on the Autism Spectrum or who have severe behavior concerns. An additional 30-40 children would be served in these classrooms. Many children are dismissed over and over by preschools not equipped to take children with challenging behaviors. Discovery Learning Center is a place where families are not turned away and their children receive the services they need.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

PARC Discovery Learning Center is the ONLY child care provider in Pinellas County of accessible Early Intervention Services to children with developmental disabilities, including those diagnosed with and/or "atrisk" for developmental delays, behavior concerns and autism. The center serves children from 2 months to 5 years. The Discovery Learning Center utilizes experienced early intervention, therapeutic and support staff to provide universal education and inclusive intervention services.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Direct services to families with children on the autism spectrum will include ABA therapy and behavior services. Family involvement is essential for maximum success. The services will be provided by trained teachers, assistant teachers, Board Certified Behavior Analysts, Registered Behavior Technicians and supporting staff.

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- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

 Children from age 2 months to 5 years with developmental disabilities
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

PARC Behavior Services Dept. work with children and adults with developmental disabilities who have significant behavioral challenges. Many of these individuals have co-occuring psychiatric diagnoses. We use the science of Applied Behavior Analysis to reduce inappropriate and challenging problem behavior and increase adaptive skills. Often times treating the inappropriate behavior requires extensive collaboration with the individual's psychiatrist, psychologist, counselor, etc. We measure the effectiveness of intervention by collecting data on each individual's problem behavior and acquisition of adaptive skills before and after treatment. We can analyze that data collectively to determine how clients are being affected by the treatment.
