- 4. Project/Program Description:

To support the launch of the Pre-law concentration, Edward Waters College is requesting \$400,000. The Pre-Law Program will be designed to prepare undergraduate students for careers in law and to contribute to the larger societal goal of diversifying the legal profession. According to the American Bar Association's National Lawyer Population Survey (2007-2017), only 5% of this nation's lawyers are African American. The American Bar Association also reports that 95% of elected prosecutors are White; with only 61 of the 2400 prosecutors being Black." To that end, the objective of the program is to enhance the pipeline for African-American prosecutors in the State of Florida and nationally. EWC students will benefit from an enriched learning environment, mentoring from legal professionals, preparation for the law school entrance exam (LSAT), public lectures, workshops, undergraduate research, internships, and scholarships.

11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Pre-Law Program will be designed to prepare undergraduate students for careers in law and to contribute to the larger societal goal of diversifying the legal profession. According to the American Bar Association's National Lawyer Population Survey (2007-2017), only 5% of this nation's lawyers are African American. The American Bar Association also reports that 95% of elected prosecutors are White; with only 61 of the 2400 prosecutors being Black. In 2017, the National Association for Law Placement published its Report on Diversity which revealed that "the overall percentage of Black/African-American associates has declined every year since 2009, except for the small increase in 2016." To that end, the objective of the program is to enhance the pipeline for African-American prosecutors in the State of Florida and nationally.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

EWC students will benefit from an enriched learning environment, mentoring from legal professionals, preparation for the law school entrance exam (LSAT), public lectures, workshops, undergraduate research, internships, and scholarships.

Edward Waters College hopes to learn from this valuable work the impact that a pre-law concentration can have on underrepresented students at HBCUs in regards to graduation, retention, and job/graduate school placement on a longitudinal scale. All findings will be presented and published.
