- a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?
 - The specific purpose/goal is to reduce crime an areas covered under the Real Time Crime Center (RTCC) assets.
- b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
 - Appropriation will fund 15 additional camera locations in high crime areas, and fund an 8-panel monitor wall to monitor potential criminal activity.
- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?
 - Use real-time intelligence to ensure command staff and analysts are able to assist and help protect officers in the field during active responses to threats. Detect and verify threats with more certainty using virtual patrols and video analytics. Provide a crime deterrent by publicizing the program and signaling its capabilities to those seeking to break the law.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served? Victims of crime and general population.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
 - A reduction of criminal activity city-wide. Monitor crime reduction in areas covered under real time crime assets.
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
 - The City has an obligation to fulfill the contract requirements, if the City breaches the terms of the contract, it should be cancelled.
