Miami Children's Museum (MCM) has a long history of providing high-quality evidence-based STEAM enriched programs to children 0-8 years of age and the training of early childhood teachers and caregivers. The museum will establish the Professional Development School Readiness Institute to impact over 3,000 Miami Dade County children and their respective families plus an exponential number of children statewide. In preparation for school readiness and greater success, this project will increase a minimum of 150+ preschool teachers' knowledge of STEAM content to utilize within their classrooms. The program will also be extended to the student's home through parent education and engagement. There will be a statewide impact by inviting educators in all FL children's museums, thus positively benefiting children's achievement statewide through informal, early childhood education.

all Florida children's museums to participate for free, earning them 8 hrs of in-service, thus positively benefiting children's achievement in the state through informal early childhood education.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Over 3,000 children and their respective families will receive the following benefits: • Children will receive 4 museum visits focused on STEAM activities by exploring the following topics: Art, music, health and nutrition. • MCM educators will visit the off-site classrooms of participating preschool teachers to model best classroom theories and practices for them to expand on with their students • Family night at MCM for parents/caregivers to gain an understanding and practice of STEAM activities from museum educators to replicate at home for their children • Classroom kit will be given to each teacher (150 teachers) containing hands-on materials and teacher lesson plans related to the following subject areas: art, music, health and nutrition • Family kit (3000 families) with literacy materials containing hands-on materials and projects related to the following subject areas: art, music, health and nutrition • 8 hrs of professional development for 150 early childhood teachers.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Over 3,000 children and their respective families will receive the following benefits: • 4 Museum visits focused on STEAM activities by exploring the following topics: art, music, health and nutrition. • MCM educators will visit the off-site classrooms of participating preschool teachers to model best classroom theories and practices for them to expand on with their students • Family night at MCM for parents/caregivers to gain an understanding and practice of STEAM activities from museum educators to replicate at home for their children • 8 hrs of professional development for 150 early childhood teachers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population: Children and families from low-income / under-served communities and the educators who work within these communities. Number served: Over 3,000 children and their respective families, plus 150 Early childhood educators.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

75 percent of the 3,000 parents/caregivers served will increase: •knowledge of strategies and techniques that will help their child continue developing in oral and written language and communication skills aligned with Florida early learning standards • literacy and critical thinking skills • vocabulary, print knowledge, and phonological awareness. All areas are aligned with Florida early learning standards. These results will be measured through pre/post testing. 85 percent of the 150 teachers served will increase: • knowledge of strategies and techniques that will help their child continue developing in oral and written language and communication skills • literacy and critical thinking skills •vocabulary, print knowledge, and phonological awareness All areas are aligned with Florida early learning standards.
