Club Challenge is a program of Challenge Enterprises of North Florida, Inc. The purpose of Club Challenge is to provide training, promote volunteer service, socialization and introduction to paid employment opportunities in the Northeast Florida area for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities that are currently on the Agency for Persons with Disabilities waiting list, unfunded adults with no post secondary education plans or job skills, senior adults, individuals with part-time jobs and individuals isolated after retirement.

11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Club Challenge is the bridge for unfunded individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities that desire to participate fully in activities that satisfy their personal goals, expand their interests, engage in volunteer service, learn about taking care of themselves and others, and exploring the possibilities of the power of work.



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b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Club members will have multiple opportunities to choose formal and informal activities that include: healthy living sessions, advocacy training and group meetings, recreational events, arts and culture programs, volunteer service at local nonprofits to gain job skills, pre-employment training session, job searching and referral services to Vocational Rehabilitation for job placement and on-the-job training. Regular scheduled activities are posted on a calendar and shared on the Club Challenge Facebook page for members to select activities and training sessions.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The trained Activity Leaders and Assistants will work directly with the adults designing personalized plans that will meet their personal goals. The staff will also introduce new activities to enrich the lives of the members. Staff will encourage Club member to participate in sessions on money management, informal activities creating friendships, escorting the individuals (small groups) to nonprofits for volunteer service hours and work skill development, transportation training to use the new limited commuter service, and learning the rules for attending meetings of the advocacy group. The services are available Monday through Friday and there are two evening events each month that include family members and friends.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
 - The target population is unfunded adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities in the North Florida area of Clay and Duval County. The membership is expected to be 25 members engaged in activities each month.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
 - 1. Improving physical health--volunteering with activities to lift, pull, push, stand, bend and stoop. There are also 4 physical activities at the Club each month. 85% of the members with this goal will participate in at least 1 monthly physical activity. 2. Transportation advocacy that promotes ridership on the local transit lines. The staff will escort the members in utilizing the new schedule. 75% of the members with a transportation goal will participate in a transit advocacy meeting. 3. Improve financial literacy in a training session or outing monthly. 75% of the members with financial goal will attend and use currency for purchases matching their personal budget plan. 4. Economic impact training will be scheduled at a quarterly meeting with a Certified Employment Specialist or attending an employment event . 85% of the Club Members with this goal will participate in a quarterly employment meeting or training event.
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The agency's standard contract penalties are sufficient.

Challenge Enterprises is the owner of the facility where Club Challenge offers programs and services. This facility is scheduled for renovations and significant upgrades by an anchor tenant at no cost to Challenge Enterprises. Club Challenge will continue to operate during the renovation period.
