11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Franklin County Emergency Management's responsibility under ch. 252, F.S., is to provide emergency response, recovery, planning, training, and mitigation. During Hurricane Michael, as well as past storms, this mission has proven to be very challenging due to the small size, location, and age of the county's EOC. A larger, centrally located EOC will greatly enhance Emergency Management's ability to provide these services to the residents of Franklin County.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

EOC activations, training to assist in maintaining NIMS compliance, Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), exercises and educational programs to better plan and prepare for disaster, as well as re-entry tags, grant management, special needs database review, healthcare facility plan reviews, community outreach, coordination, mitigation, response, and recovery.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Activations, training, exercises, Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), education, re-entry tags, grant management, special needs database, healthcare facility plan reviews, community outreach services, and public notification are some of the direct services that will be provided to the citizens of Franklin County. The goal is always life safety and to educate, plan, and prepare residents for disasters to help meet this goal.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by the project is all of Franklin County. As of July 1, 2017, the county's current population estimate was 11,727. Franklin County has a total area of 1,026 square miles, of which 535 square miles is land and 492 square miles is water, which makes the small rural county a popular vacation spot. During the months of June through November (hurricane season), the county's population can almost double due to visitors.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

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The expected benefit of this project will enable Franklin County Emergency Management to better serve Franklin County citizens and enhance efforts to meet goals of life safety. A centrally located, larger EOC allows for more access to residents throughout Franklin County to attend the activities and services provided by Franklin County Emergency Management.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Franklin County will retain 10 percent of the contractor's payment until the Building Inspector approves the new building. Standard contract penalties are sufficient for the contract between the county and the state for requested funds.
