 Establishing an additional 70 units of permanent supportive housing for homeless Veterans, youth, families, and those experiencing chronic homelessness.

 Homeless veterans, youth, families, and those experiencing chronic homelessness (approximately 51-100 individuals).
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
 - The number of persons sleeping on the streets in Hillsborough County will decrease by 5 percent. This will be measured by the Annual Homeless Point-in-Time Count (surveying and data analysis).
