To provide funding to the University of South Florida for a study on alternative forms of treatment for veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) who have been diagnosed with a service-connected post traumatic stress disorder and/or a traumatic brain injury. From this study, the University of South Florida will further research to identify the effectiveness of the five listed treatments; accelerated resolution therapy, equine therapy, hyperbaric oxygen therapy, music therapy, and service animal training therapy.

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

To provide appropriations for the purpose of providing alternative forms of treatment for veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI). The appropriation will allow USF to set up a pilot program by contracting with non-profit organizations, approved by USF, that provide alternative treatments to veterans.

- b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
 - USF will contract with non-profit organizations that will provide alternative treatments for veterans suffering from PTSD and TBI.
- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?
 - USF will contract with non-profit organizations that will provide alternative treatments for veterans suffering from PTSD and TBI.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
 - Veterans diagnosed with posttraumatic stress disorder and/or traumatic brain injuries who have been diagnosed with a service-connected posttraumatic stress disorder and/or a traumatic brain injury. Target population: Persons with poor mental & physical health, Homeless and Drug users.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Assist veterans with their post-war injuries, with a specialization on PTSD and TBI. Number of veterans who are in treatment for PTSD and TBI through the program. Veterans with control of their PTSD and TBI are more likely to be employed. Surveys of veteran's pre and post treatment including employment status. Veterans who are no longer suffering or have control of their PTSD and TBI are less likely to abuse prescription pain killers or other drugs and less likely to commit offenses. Regular check-ups with veterans who have gone through the therapies.
