a.	hat specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?			
	Many children in foster care demonstrate negative behaviors as a result of a lack of positive parenting, trauma and lack of attachment			
	to a caregiver. By adolescence, many of these children are difficult or impossible to find a long term placement because of their			

	to a caregiver. By adolescence, many of these children are difficult or impossible to find a long term placement because of their negative behavior and lack of emotional regulation. By teaching children prosocial skills and how to regulate their emotions during the "middle years" of 6-11, many negative outcomes can be avoided.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	13 weekly SNAP gender-specific and concurrent groups for children and parents, in addition to ongoing case management.
C.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Groups for 13 weeks.
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	Children ages 6-11 who are in the care and custody of DCF and are placed in Kinship or Foster Care. A total of 24 families will be served at each project site, for a total of 96 families per year.
e.	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	Increase in family functioning and child behavior (as measured by standardized instruments such as Child Behavior Checklist).  Increase in stability of DCF placements for those families that complete the program (as measured by the difference in placement stability for participating families and those that do not).
f.	What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
	Since payment is made on a fee for service basis, if services are not provided, no distribution of funds will occur.
