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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Replace existing fire station built in 1963 that serves 134 square miles of Levy County, but does not meet current local, state, or federal building codes. Provide facilities in Bronson for staffing an Ambulance during severe storms instead of the local Ambulance being required to leave the Town and respond out of the County Operations Center several miles away, which significantly increases response time to emergencies.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction to meet all current codes for a public facility providing public safety services. The Town has already acquired the land for this project.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Fire protection, fire prevention, rescue, emergency medical services, hazard mitigation, public fire safety education, public safety training, "A Safe Haven for Newborns", "Safe Place" for adolescents, Town Emergency Operations Center.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The entire population of Levy County (40,801) will be served, plus over 1,000 additional daytime population in county and state offices, 300 inmates in County Jail, businesses and visitors, and town, county, and state critical infrastructure, as Bronson FD not only provides primary response to the Town and 130 square miles of unincorporated Levy County, but also responds in the county-wide automatic aid system throughout the remainder of the County. The building will also serve as a centrally located regional location for public meetings as well as community groups and provide a centrally located training room for local, county, regional, state, and federal entities. The facility will also provide a regional benefit from mutual aid response to surrounding counties. The project will benefit all other fire agencies in not only our county, but surrounding counties as well, as we not only rely on them to provide additional resources, but they also rely on us to provide resources to them.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

A facility meeting codes for safety/health/accessibility, allow proper storage/maintenance/security of fire/rescue equipment/vehicles, environmentally safe vehicle exhaust evacuation system, emergency generator back-up power, additional capacity for fire & EMS vehicles, and living quarters for firefighters and EMS personnel that the current station does not provide and is not capable of alteration to provide. Enhanced emergency response/improved response times will be a an outcome with ability to have station staffed by firefighters, instead of volunteer firefighters responding from home due to no bunkroom or shower facilities. This will also enable the benefit of programs such as "Safe Haven for Newborns" and "Safe Place" for adolescents in distress, provide a town EOC and back-up county EOC, enable emergency services to remain in town during storms. Outcomes can be measured by list of issues resolved, documentation of improved staffing, response times, facility use, and jobs created.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Current generally accepted penalties for non-compliance will be included in the bid award. The Town of Bronson will establish a critical path schedule with date-specific targets. Target dates not met will have monetary penalties, and if severe enough, the contractor's ineligibility for future government projects. Retainer of a set percentage of payments to contractors to provide quality assurance throughout the construction process.
