	a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?
	Inclusive play opportunities are crucial in enhancing mental health for both the children and their caretakers. In addition, interaction between children of varying ages and abilities fosters enriched cultural experiences through cooperation and communication during play.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	The inclusive playground will be available for use by residents of Lake, Orange, and Seminole counties as well as visitors from out of the area. Camp Thunderbird currently runs week-long camping programs for children with disabilities; the playground would be a welcome addition to their normal programming.
C.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	The inclusive playground would provide play opportunities and physical recreation for children of all abilities. It would also foster social interactions between the children and also their caregivers.

Since the playground is a tangible object, penalties for the City or for Quest would not be appropriate once the playground has been built. The only recourse would be to have an alternative outside agency to oversee the programming at the site to better serve the public needs.
