Improvements to drainage issues being experienced on State Road (SR) A1A within the town limits of Highland Beach. There are fifty-six (56) flood points outlined in the Drainage Evaluation Report, which was prepared for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) in 2016. The installation of a discharge outlet including excavating roadside blockages and swales and installing periodic permeable pavement with under drain systems, which will all reduce the puddling, ponding and flooding within SR A1A.

There are fifty-six (56) flood points outlined in the Drainage Evaluation Report, which was prepared for the Florida Department of Transportation in 2016.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Installation of a discharge outlet including excavating roadside blockages and swales and installing periodic permeable pavement with underdrain systems, which will all reduce the puddling, ponding and flooding within SR A1A.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Drainage improvements within SR A1A right of way within the Town of Highland Beach.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project is the entire general public and residents of the Town. The Town's population is approximately 3,600 and 8,000 including seasonal residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Storm water improvements and reduction of pollutant loads into the intracoastal waterways. The improvements will keep roads dry and keep flooding to a minimum. Right of way enhancements will be experienced based upon the improvements. The method of measuring the level of benefit is based upon visual flooding, ponding and puddling withing the Town after a rain event. Also, the evaluation report outlines the benefits.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

If the drainage issues are not resolved within the Town limits there will be continued flooding in the outlined 56 points which may pose traveling and safety issues on SR A1A.
