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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

STVE specific purpose and goals are to empower, transform and improve the quality of life for our youth and young adults ages 10-17. We strive to
save lives and reduce crime by offering various educational programs, workshops and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math) activities. We
provide anti-violence, mentoring/conflict resolution, community outreach and field trips to redirect the lives of our at-risk youth and young adults.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities and services provided to meet the purposes will be educational and job preparedness programs and workshops that will aid in transforming and improving the quality of lives for our youth and young adults throughout the community. Our programs are designed to reduce and/or eliminate crimes, create community partnership and bridge the gap between citizens and police officers. Our workshops on anti-violence/bullying, mentoring/conflict resolution workshops help with modifying aggression behaviors, study skills and team building exercises.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students will be provided tutoring that will assist them in completing their homework and class work based on OCPS curriculum, job preparedness workshops will be administered with mock interviewing skills, teaching students community outreach by partnering with the community for volunteer activities and specific workshops that will teach study skills and conflict resolution.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Stop the Violence and Embrace, Inc. target population is youth and young adults ages 10-17 within the surrounding low-income; high crime areas. We expect to serve anywhere from 51-100 individuals over a years time.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit and outcome of this project is to positively impact our youth and young adults by reducing crime and creating law-abiding hardworking citizens. We will provide anger and conflict/bullying management workshops. A number of pre-employment job preparedness workshops for chronically unemployed/underemployed individuals will be held. STVE will host workshops for family members who have been impacted by crime to implement coping skills. Outcome benchmarks will be measured by completion of tutoring sessions, graduation rates, attendance and retention. How many participants stay in school/out of trouble, grade/test score gains. A survey will be administered to address the issues, concerns/effectiveness of the program and on-going improvements. The community partners will have an opportunity to determine program effectiveness by showing continual support and attend our various school events. Our assessments will determine attitude, educational/social level improvements.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
