4. **Project/Program Description**

Stormwater discharge system improvements to increase water quality by reducing harmful pollutants and minerals from discharging into the C-14 canal, which is an integral part of the regional South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) canal system located in Western Broward County, linking the Florida Everglades to the ocean. This will be accomplished by diverting the runoff from 6 outflows that currently discharge untreated runoff water directly into the C-14 canal to one large outflow for pretreatment prior to discharging into this SFWMD canal.

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#### 11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project will improve stormwater quality by removing or reducing harmful pollutants and minerals from Southgate Blvd. stormwater runoff prior to discharging into the C-14 Canal, eliminate surcharging from the C-14 Canal into the City's stormwater management system during large storm events, and will address current regulatory concerns with the City's stormwater management system.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Tamarac has six stormwater outfalls along Southgate Boulevard. These outfalls discharge stormwater runoff directly into the C-14 Canal that is a part of regional SFWMD canal system, linking the Everglades to the ocean. This runoff contains minerals and other urban stormwater pollutants including herbicides, pesticides, trash, etc. The project stops this direct discharge of pollutants into the C-14 Canal and diverts it into one, large outfall to be pretreated according to federal and local regulations. Once treated, the water may be discharged into the C-14 canal. The project will also eliminate potential surcharging from the C-14 canal into the City's stormwater management system during large storm events/hurricanes.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Enhanced quality of surface water and public health protection, enhanced environmental quality in close proximity to the Everglades, improved stormwater management.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Populations of the City of Tamarac, City of Coral Springs, and cities traversed by the C-14 canal flowing east, including North Lauderdale, Margate, Coconut Creek, and Pompano Beach. Estimated number of individuals is nearly 470,000.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected public and environmental benefits include a cleaner C-14 canal through reductions in stormwater pollutants entering the waterway. The Methodology will be measurements of contaminants such as fecal coliform with a goal of reducing these contaminants by 22%. A clean canal system running through various cities is essential to public health in Broward County.
