a.	What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?
	Research shows that 1 in 5 children and adolescents suffer from a mental health disorder, with symptoms such as anxiety, disruptive behavior, or changes in mood and eating patterns. These issues are sometimes inter-related with issues of drug or alcohol abuse and can lead to life-threatening situations.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	This program will minimize service gaps for our youth and adult population who may suffer from a variety of mental health issues.
C.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Funding is being requested to support programming. Early intervention is essential to preventing and deterring negative behavior and any potential for mental health disorders. Our low-income, at-risk community is seeking support that will create a positive impact on students. Support is needed for this community outreach for mental health initiatives.
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	This program will minimize service gaps for our youth and adult population who may suffer from a variety of mental health issues.
