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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funding for the NJCC programs will not only assist the child victims, but also adult victims, disabled, homeless, and underserved community, all of whom fall prey to sexual assault, human trafficking, and abusive offenders. The Advocate Program will affect a up to 400 victims of sexual assault and abuse; and the Anti-Human Trafficking Program will provide direct and intensive case management services to 25 victims yet reach the entire community with and educational outreach program.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Victim-centered trauma informed services will be provided to victims of child abuse, sexual violence, children and adults who are victims of HT or those at risk of HT and non-offending family members to support them through the investigation and healing process. A comprehensive and coordinated system of care will be established to respond to the needs of victims of HT. NJCC will serve as the coordinating entity in connecting victims to needed intensive services. Funding will provide for the following services: intake and eligibility assessment; victim advocacy and accompaniment; life skills training; and referrals for housing; mental health services; medical/dental care; legal services; education assistance; referrals to needed services; assistance in navigating through the prosecutorial phase, courtroom orientations, assistance with completing documentation including crime victim compensation; and attending multi-disciplinary staffing.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Crisis intervention, information and referrals to needed services, intensive case management, advocacy, accompaniment to activities related to the citizen's victimization (court, medical, etc).

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

At-risk population, victims of sexual assault, human trafficking, and general community. Up to 400 victims of sexual assault and abuse; and 25 victims of human trafficking.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Higher likelihood for victims and their families to go through the investigative process and the the prosecution phase. When victims engage and follow through with prosecution in increases public safety. A more positive outcome for client physical, mental and overall wellbeing. Outcomes will be measured through customer/stakeholder satisfaction surveys.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Reduction in approved appropriation.
