4. Project/Program Description

Florida Ocean Alliance (FOA) will develop a Draft Comprehensive Ocean and Coastal Policy based on the 2020 Strategic Plan. FOA will collaborate with State agencies, including FDEP, FWC, and DEO, as well as private sector stakeholders to coordinate, complement, and supplement development of a statewide policy that is comprehensive, integrated and forward thinking. The policy will identify priority issues for future legislative action and funding. FOA's role is essential to establish a framework for connected leadership among Florida's public, private and independent sector stakeholders associated with Florida's ocean and coastal economy. The Florida Ocean and Coastal Policy will bridge the gap between policy and stewardship of Florida's rich portfolio of ocean and coastal resource assets (natural and human-built). A report to the Legislature will be prepared by June 30, 2021 that provides draft language for the statewide policy, including priority issues, strategies and actions.

11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Development of comprehensive ocean and coastal policies for Florida. A report to the Legislature will be prepared by June 30, 2021 that provides draft language for the statewide ocean and coastal policy, including priority issues, strategies and recommended actions to protect, diversify and expand Florida's ocean and coastal leadership and economic value.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Develop policy with review of statutes in other jurisdictions, discussions with key experts, and drafting of policies to share with key experts in and out of state government. Develop funding priorities, implementation plans, and "completed project" evaluation criteria.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

No direct services. Overall policy for protecting and managing Florida's oceans and coasts for the present and future will help guide Florida's governments as they move ahead facing climate change and sea level rise and other environmental challenges. An overarching framework for dealing with these issues is very critical along with development of funding priorities, implementation plans, and "completed project" evaluation criteria.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida's population at large, local and state governments. Recommended policy will be prepared for consideration by the Governor and Legislature. The policy will identify priority issues for future legislative action and funding. FOA's role is essential to establish a framework for connected leadership among Florida's public, private and independent sector stakeholders associated with Florida's ocean and coastal economy.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Florida will have a set of broad, comprehensive goals for protecting and managing its oceans and coasts with legislative language for consideration as a bill. It will have specific strategies and tactics to accomplish those goals. This will provide the means to handle continued growth of Florida's coastal population and to incorporate best management practices into the state's government regulations and statutes. Methodology: Statutory review, policy analysis, meetings with policy experts, development of goals, objectives, and strategies.
