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The purpose of the Community Dialogue Technical Assistance Program is to educate local governments and other community leaders as to the value of developing affordable and supportive housing for persons with disabling conditions, special needs, or experiencing homelessness. The goal of the

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

program is that more communities will develop supportive housing.

	Activities include face-to-face technical assistance with presentations by successful Florida supportive housing programs, distribution of resource materials including current and projected funding opportunities from local, state, and federal sources, identified community need, establishment of a community steering committee, and the development of an individually written step by step action plan for supportive housing initiatives.
c.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Ninety percent of the program is direct face-to-face services to local leadership such as city and county commissioners, law enforcement, banks, foundations, chambers of commerce, service providers, churches and other faith based organizations, housing authorities, affordable housing developers, and other stakeholders including potential residents. The technical assistance is specifically designed to bring together key officials in each selected community (county).
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	The Community Dialogue Technical Assistance Program is designed to target persons with disabling conditions and special needs or individuals and families experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness. These are persons with serious mental illnesses or substance abuse disorders, veterans and elders with disabilities, youth aging out of foster care, developmentally disabled, and families and children in the child welfare system experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness. It is difficult to estimate the number of persons who will be housed as each supportive housing development could range from 50 units to 200 units or more. It is anticipated that at least one or two applications will be submitted by the counties receiving this technical assistance.
e.	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	The expected outcome is that counties receiving the technical assistance will, at a minimum, submit an application to develop special needs, homeless, or other supportive housing units. It is anticipated that the number of supportive housing units will increase over time due to the technical assistance. The long term goal is to reduce and prevent homelessness by creating more stable housing options. Applications to Florida Housing Finance Corporation and HUD and resulting awards to communities receiving the Community Dialogue Technical Assistance will be monitored as well as various applications and awards for federal voucher programs as well as mainstream services funding.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
