4. **Project/Program Description**

Estero is requesting an appropriation to maximize public use of village land on the Estero River. Uses of these funds include: 1) Walking trails: construct miles of trails, creating a regionally significant, passive recreation asset dedicated to the study, protection, and enjoyment of nature. 2) Riverfront walkway: build a walkway along the Estero River to provide residents with a unique opportunity to experience the Estero River frontage via foot or bike. 3) Connecting access trail: create a connection between village and state land (Koreshan State Park), to allow the community to traverse both properties, creating a regional asset. This trail would serve to greatly expand the public utility of both assets. 4) On-site amenities: build public restrooms, water fountains, and other related public facilities on-site. This would create an accommodating, accessible, and enjoyable experience for Lee County residents, which is the purpose of this venture and government.

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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

These funds are requested to expand passive recreation and conservation efforts in south Lee County via the establishment of a regionally significant natural asset. The village spent a significant amount of money to acquire this property (\$24.5 million) in early 2019, but the land does not have the amenities necessary to support public access or enjoyment, such as walking trails, a river walkway, or public restrooms. The requested funds will not only improve, and make accessible, Estero land but will connect to Koreshan State Park, thereby enhancing this public asset as well.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The following amenities will be constructed on-site to create the experience outlined above. 1) Walking trails: construct miles of trails, creating a regionally significant, passive recreation asset dedicated to the study, protection, and enjoyment of nature. 2) Riverfront walkway: build a walkway along the Estero River to provide residents with a unique opportunity to experience the Estero River frontage via foot or bike. 3) Connecting access trail: create a connection between village and state land (Koreshan State Park) to allow the community to traverse both properties, creating a regional asset. This trail would serve to greatly expand the public utility of both assets. 4) On-site amenities: build public restrooms, water fountains, and other related public facilities on-site. This would create an accommodating, accessible, and enjoyable experience for Lee County residents, which is the purpose of this venture and government.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Initially, this project will serve to provide Lee County residents with an accessible, beautiful preserve to enjoy. This will include protection of the natural assets on site as well as maintenance of invasive species. In addition, the village hopes to partner with Florida Gulf Coast University, Koreshan State Park, and local nonprofits to provide programming on-site to fully maximize the value of this incredible public asset.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Unlike an active recreation space, this passive recreation space will be open to and enjoyable by everyone. Additionally, given the size of this property, its river access, and the potential to connect this land with Koreshan State Park, residents from across Lee County will seek out this space. The public amenities will be constructed to serve Lee County residents of all ages and abilities. While the number of individuals that will be served cannot be estimated at this time, public interest is expected to be substantial.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is public use of the recently purchased village land. Actual visitor traffic may be tracked on the site, though traffic will continue to be tracked at Koreshan State Park; greater resident traffic anticipated on the site will result in greater public use of the state park as well.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The village would not be contracting based on visitor traffic. However, Estero would hold payment for delivery of construction services not rendered correctly, or timely, by consultants and contractors.
