4. **Project/Program Description**

Construction of Riverwalk Phase II project will enhance the downtown waterfront area and increase connectivity through a system of pathways linking existing public facilities, including parks, multi-use trails and public parking areas. Phase II construction will include development of a Permatrek concrete pier/walkway, two pedestrian bridges, lighting, landscaping, and installation of amenities including gateways, interpretive signage, benches, trash receptacles, and electrical outlets.

Requested funds will be matched with \$1.7 million in RESTORE Act funding received, \$1.0 million of local funding, and \$500,000 in donated property rights.

Construction of the Riverwalk Phase II project will enhance the downtown waterfront area and increase connectivity through a system of pathways linking existing public facilities, including parks, multi-use trails, and public parking areas. Phase II construction will include development of a Permatrek concrete pier/walkway, two pedestrian bridges, lighting, landscaping, and installation of amenities including gateways, interpretive signage, benches, trash receptacles, and electrical outlets.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Completion of the Riverwalk will provide infrastructure that will be open to the general public for activities such as walking, strolling, jogging, sightseeing, shopping, restaurant going, and many others.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Riverwalk will be open to the public for recreational and transportation purposes. It will serve as a hub for local tourism related activities, connecting multiple businesses along the Kings Bay shoreline and downtown area.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
