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1.	Program Performance
а.	What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested? Seminole County Public Schools would like to expand an existing career and technical education program to support more students as they obtain skills through industry certifications. The Construction Trades program fulfills a local economic demand for skilled labor and students can immediately enter the workforce or pursue higher education.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	The 2019-20 FL Dept. of Economic Opportunity Regional Demand List identifies corresponding occupations with four target areas of our program (HVAC, Electrical, Welding, and General Trades). Career Source (2018) and UCF Institute for Economic Competitiveness (2017) identified construction as the fastest growing sector in Metro Orlando. This program provides students the skills and certifications to compete in the job market or continue in higher education.
C.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Leveraging the student choice policies in the district, students can opt into the program and obtain skills and industry certifications that lead to immediate employment or will be useful in higher education.
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	This funding will allow the Construction Trades Program to expand by serving the students on the wait list. Students will obtain skills that are regionally in demand and the local business community has demonstrated their support for the project through letters and donations of personnel and equipment.
e.	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	The program can be evaluated in the following ways: analyze district-collected records related to student internship/job shadow experiences; survey students participating in courses and earning industry certifications; and analyze graduating senior exit surveys.
f.	What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
	Failure to meet deliverables would result in financial consequences including withholding of funding or reduction in specified payments.
