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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To create customized employment opportunities, work experiences, and transition planning for each student, driven by student's interests, support needs, strengths, and contributions rather than by generic job descriptions and available openings. Customized implies flexibility and creativity enabling support staff to modify parameters and desired outcomes as the student's interests and skills evolve. Create entrepreneurial options for self-employment as post school outcomes or career experience options for students, in addition to traditional wage employment. And last, but not least, link employment vendors to th school to promote collaborative funding of employment and transitional activities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

To create a training program that focuses on the development of the general competencies required for work in competitive employment. To create a training program that focuses on the development of general competencies required to work in the child care industry. Procure contract work that would involve work for private businesses under contract for a price. The world will be utilized as a tool for on-the-job training. Activities may involve sorting, collating, assembling, and packaging products. To create innovative small business models designed around the skills and interests of the students such as, a training program that focuses on the necessary skills to work in the food service industry (In Good Tastes), a training program that teaches the necessary skills to effectively manage, design, create, package, and sell candles for a bath and beauty business (Candles & Such). Minimum 30 hours per week for 11 months to teach competencies in math, reading, and life skills.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

85% of the clients will demonstrate an increased awareness and knowledge of the general competencies required for work during the term of the contract. 25% of the clients completing the program shall be competitively employed or self-employed within 6 months of completing the program, during the term of the contract. We are currently servicing 68 clients. We have placed 4 individuals in competitive employment, have hired 3 child care trainees as classroom assistants, and have hired 10 clients in the current work program.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This program makes possible the employment of individuals with disabilities that have been largely excluded from the employment market. In Executive Order 13-284, employment is the most cost effective and direct means available to help individuals achieve independence and self-fulfillment. A good job often makes the difference between successful independent living in the community. A more direct benefit to the State of Florida and taxpayers is the avoidance of institutional and other high cost residential placement that comes from reliance on expensive publicly funding deep-end services. Bottom line, individuals with jobs contribute to the economy. We expect to serve from 51-100 individuals with developmental/intellectual disabilities with this program.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

By using the performance review from each individual client we can access the effectiveness of their performance. This review is done on a monthly basis. The objectives are as follows: job knowledge, work quality, attendance/punctuality, initiative, communication/listening skills, dependability. The ratings are: progressing, needs work, satisfactory, good, exceptional.
