The program targets underemployed, unemployed, transitioning veterans, and high school and college students. |

| | This project will expand the capabilities of current programs to serve Hillsborough County's logistics and manufacturing companies by providing state of the art, hands-on classroom spaces and the equipment needed to support today's distribution centers. It will also provide training and certification for 234 residents per year for a total of expected certifications of 292 per year, not counting the number of graduates of HCC's for-credit programs. |
