).	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	Tasks include the design and implementation of a behavioral survey to determine the evacuation behavior of citizens from the most recent storm seasons of 2016-2019. Begin work on a methodology to produce an updated regional evacuation study including data needs, technological advances, and coordination with local, state, and federal emergency management partners.
	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Valuable data to local and statewide decision makers regarding the evacuation behavior of Floridians. This directly impacts hurricane preparedness efforts and helps to protect the citizens of Florida.
	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	The entire population of Florida is vulnerable to the effects of a hurricane, whether directly (storm surge, winds, and flooding) or indirectly (increased congestion on roadways, lack of services, and etc.).
	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	 Behavioral survey results from a representative sample across the state of Florida. Updated methodology to complete the update to the regional evacuation studies, last completed in 2010. Coordination among local, state, and federal emergency management partners and all key stakeholders.
