	What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?
	Support a pilot program that will grant approximately 200 children with chronic pain access to alternative opioid interventions such as acupuncture, massage therapy, psychotherapy and biofeedback sessions to show within months from the visit to our pain clinic, utilizing alternative therapies a percentage of patients were home bound and able to return to school and a percentage of children could return to playing sports and staying off medications.
	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
ı	Approximately 200 children experiencing chronic pain will be provided access to alternative opioid interventions such as acupuncture, massage therapy, psychotherapy and biofeedback sessions.
	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Providing interventions such as acupuncture, massage therapy, psychotherapy and biofeedback sessions. These alternatives therapies provide relief without the negative addictive properties of opioids.
	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	Approximately 200 children experiencing chronic pain.
	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	When Dr. Cucchiaro conducted a similar study at Children's Hospital Los Angeles, they demonstrated that within 4 months from the child's visit at their clinics 74% that were home bound were able to return to school and 65% could return to play sports and stay off of addictive medications like opioids.
