11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The activities and services that will be provided are pre-construction planning of a multi-purpose community and performing arts center in Miami-Dade County; acquisition or repositioning of arts and artifacts to support education, performing arts programs, and other social programs; and financial support of costs to operate and expand current nonprofit community based programs

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The first part of the project is completing the pre-construction planning of the community/ performing arts center. This is not creating a run of the mill community center that serves a small specific segment of the population. Instead, this will be a multi-function facility that will do more for the community and serve more people.

Second, the project will expand current programs to help more people. These programs include but are not limited to homebuyer/financial education; youth outreach; safety and empowerment workshops; and a career development program which provides one-on-one employment services to homeless, disabled, veterans, youth, or persons with a criminal background as an effort to prevent recidivism.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

After the first part of the project is completed and other funds have been raised to build the community/performing arts center, citizens all over South Florida will enjoy various cultural performances; Asian and Caribbean arts; sport programs geared towards minority youth; and job creation.

Second, citizens all over South Florida will greatly benefit from increased services and a large portion of the general population actually needs services such as financial literacy; tax assistance and tax advocacy; extra education on safety and healthy living; and one-on-one employment assistance to atrisk populations, just to name a few.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is veterans, elderly, homeless persons, disabled individuals, youth, low-income individuals, minorities, and at-risk populations. Additionally, it will serve the general public.

After the first part of the project is completed and funds have been raised to build the community/performing arts center, thousands of people every week will be served.

The second part of the project is expected to double or triple the current number of individuals served and reach more people all over South Florida rather than a few specific cities.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits or outcomes of this project are: improved physical health, improved mental health, enriched cultural experience, improved quality of education, enhanced/preserved/improved environmental or fish and wildlife quality, improved transportation conditions, increased or improved economic activity, increased tourism, created specific immediate job opportunities, enhanced specific individual's economic self-sufficiency, reduced recidivism, diverted from criminal/juvenile justice system, and increased homeownership for positive social benefits once building is fully operation. The methods by which this outcome will be measured include: attendance data, youth attendance data, background case notes, economic impact reports, 10% of program youth considered high risk and missed program activities due to normal business reasons and not because of an arrest, employee salary data, etc.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

For each percentage of under performance, the same percentage of total funding will be returned for failing to meet deliverables. In addition, all unused funds on this project will be returned to the state.
