#### 12. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The hardened building with increased size would allow the Golden Gate Senior Center to better organize their programs for area seniors, and also allow the community to take better advantage of aid opportunities available immediately after emergencies and other natural disasters.

Expanded space will also be used by the Golden Gate Library in partnership with the Senior Center.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities and services through the Golden Gate Senior Center (GGSC) occur through a variety of community partnerships serving area seniors including the Collier County Community & Human Services (CHS) Senior Nutrition Program where the GGSC hosts the senior lunch program. CHS also administers the senior utility assistance program and the Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly program.

The Golden Gate Library would be able to better meet spacial needs for library programs, directly impacting the Center's ability to expand programming opportunities for their seniors. Activities and services would be further expanded and provide much needed resiliency efforts during and immediately after emergency situations through partnerships with FEMA, Red Cross, Salvation Army, local government, etc...

The Golden Gate Senior Center is home to programs, activities, and services providing wellness, education, nutritional meals, financial assistance, utility assistance, civic and recreational events for community seniors in need of such services. Additional program room space will allow the adjacent Golden Gate Library to expand their educational, informational, and recreational programming to the needs of all ages within the community as well as programming specifically in support of and targeting senior needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is seniors, 60+ years of age living within the Golden Gate community and southeastern areas of Collier County, and their caregivers.

More than 1,300 individuals are regularly served by the Golden Gate Senior Center.

Expansion of the Center will provide the needed space for growth of services to Collier County's seniors.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will allow the Golden Gate Senior Center and Collier County to improve and expand upon the mental and physical wellbeing, nutrition, financial resiliency, safety, and other life-enhancing services of Collier's senior population and their caregivers.

The methodology to be used to ensure project outcomes are met and sustained will be through pre- and post-surveys to measure satisfaction and improved wellbeing.

Usage data will also be gathered and analyzed for performance metrics.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

There are no further suggested penalties. Services to Collier County's seniors would still continue through the Golden Gate Senior Center.

Services provided by the Golden Gate Senior Center are critical to the wellbeing and resiliency of Collier County's senior population.
