Improve the roads in downtown Treasure Island.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Improve safety of roadways.

Once the city downtown roadway improvements are completed, a follow-up pavement assessment will be conducted. The results will be compared to the pavement assessment provided in 2016.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improve the tourist, consumer, and commuter experience by having a safer roadway available. Improve the ability of city services to be administered to downtown businesses.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population is the approximately 7,000 full time residents and the over 15,000 residents that call Treasure Island their winter home.

In addition, businesses and tourist will better served by these improvements.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is to have improved roadways in the downtown area to improve city services to businesses, tourist and residents.

Along with improving the roads, any curbing removal and replacement will enhance the storm water collection in the immediate areas.

Once the project is complete a pavement assessment will be conducted to measure the outcome.

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The City of Treasure Island is diligent in ensuring that all project deliverables are met within required time frames. If an issue is anticipated, the city will coordinate with the Department of Transportation in advance to make any necessary adjustments.
