#### 12. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

LiFT (DBA LiFT Academy & LiFT University Transition Program) has grown by a combined 600% since its founding in 2013. Serving more than 140 students with neurodiversity (including autism, ADHD, & learning disabilities), LiFT is seeking to find a permanent home to meet the growing enrollment to support the educational, social, interpersonal, and independent living & life skills preparation for students Kindergarten through age 22. LiFT is seeking to expand services to include pre-K, more robust adult day programming, and residential care.

LiFT is seeking to expand services & double in size over the next 3-5 years.

LiFT has now identified a property and seeking to re-purpose the existing building by employing a 3-phase process in securing, renovating, and opening a new space.

Phase 1 would entail down payment to secure property using 2019 legislative funding.

Phase 2 would be to complete all required renovations in which LiFT would use 2021 legislative funding.

Phase 3 is opening



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

LiFT projects 25% growth in the student population each year for the next 5 years.
As LiFT has grown 600% over the past 7 years, we have outgrown our available space.
Moreover, LiFT is enhancing its programmatic service array to include pre-K services, more robust adult day programming, a Family Resource Center, and enhancements to current elementary, middle, high, and post-secondary educational opportunities for students with neurodiversity.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Same as above.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Children ages 0-17 (LiFT Academy), young adults ages 18-22 (LiFT University Transition Program), and adults ages 23 and beyond in LiFT Day Program.

LiFT anticipates the ability to serve more than 250 in LiFT Academy, 75 in LiFT University Transition Program, and 25 in the Day Program.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Enhanced educational, social, interpersonal, & peer development, employability skills, and more robust access to community resources and services.

LiFT utilizes many methods to track these outcomes including MAP Testing and Assessments, Individualized Support Plans, Attendance Reports, and other data collection tools.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Should LiFT fail to meet the deliverables or performance measures outlined in the contract, LiFT would not be permitted to apply for future State Appropriations funding for a period of 3 (three) years.

Funds will be used exclusively for the purchase & required renovations for the new campus to benefit the students, families, and community of LiFT.
