#### 12. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds allow us to provide emergency shelter for homeless women veterans and their children. We will also provide preventive services to keep veterans in their homes. We will increase participation in our HerTOTALWellness program which addresses mental health through psycho-edcational workshops and activities, community engagement, and economic empowerment.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Operation HandUP supports all of our other programs becuse it assists our participants in completing the program requirements. It also helps walk-in, agency referred, and 211 calls clients in distress. Our three signature programs (HerTOTALWellness, HerBIZ, HerHEALTHYLife) provides personal and professional development. Our goal is to ensure barriers are minimized while participants are going through a program. Also, we provide case management to ensure veterans are able to get back on their feet and be self sufficient.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Mental health counseling, rent and utilities assistance, emergency shelter, transportation, food, and clothing help. In addition, our programs offer art therapy, yoga, and self care retreats.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Women veterans of all ages, to include those with poor mental and physical health, jobless, economically disadvantaged, homeless, physically disabled, victims of crimes, and formally incarcerated. We expect to assist 175 or more clients/participnts

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve mental health, enhance economic self-sufficiency, and improve housing stability. The outcome will show a decrease in homelessness among women veterans, increase participation in signature programs and decrease suicide among women veterans. This will be shown through data gathering.

Inability to request state funding for proposed projects for the organization for a minimum of two years.
