12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project would relieve the area by allowing the excess rainfall to flow into Canal 11 or Sago Lake, rather than ponding within the roads, sidewalks and yards of the residences. Hazardous conditions will be eliminated for elementary school students walking or biking to school and commuters, as well as the residents living in the project area. Davis Road, is a well-traveled road and has high exposure but a medium frequency of flooding occurrence. The location and characteristics of the road, with limited intersections with traffic control measures, provide quick access between the north and south sides of the Village.

Police and fire rescue responders use Davis Road frequently due to its connectivity with other local streets.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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This improvement project will protect the area from flooding waters that accumulate due to the lack of stormwater structures. There are only 2 existing catch basins within the Davis Road right-of-way to handle the rainfall for the entire corridor.

Davis Road is delineated as a Special Flood Hazard Area (AE). Once the improvement project is in place, persistent flooding during minimal events will be alleviated and prolonged durations of standing water after excessive rainfall events will be lessened.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The lack of positive outfall within the Davis Road North drainage basin affects the entire area, with periods of standing water. The single family homes that are on Davis Road, Barbados Drive, Tortuga Road, Jamaica Drive, Morgans Way and Andros Road all use Davis Road as sole access to the community and every day needs. Residences that live on or right near Davis Road have a flooding threat literally at their door steps, with potential damage to their cars parked in their driveways. Further, the Village at large is impacted when this primary collector street (Davis Road) is flooded. The improvement project will allow the stormwaters to flow into the L-11 Canal and will prevent future flooding and the risk for property damage.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The entire project area, which includes the 5 side streets, will benefit by improved stormwater facilities. The current flooding affects 133 single family homes or approximately 343 people, as well as the traveling public (5,340 cars per day on an average school/work day). Parents need to get their children to/from Palm Springs Elementary School with an occupancy of 846 students and 71 teachers, and a majority of them travel along this section of Davis Road, which increases the inconvenience caused by current flooding.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Once the improvement project is in place, persistent flooding during minimal events will be alleviated and prolonged durations of standing water after excessive rainfall events will be lessened.

This improvement project will protect the area from flooding waters that accumulate due to the lack of stormwater structures. Citizens will be able to commute by walking, biking or driving without standing water. Residents that live along this section of Davis Road will not have standing water in their front yards with potential to do property damage, and residents along the five (5) side streets

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

\$500.00 per day fine for failure to complete design and construction drawings and bid documents by the date stated in the appropriation request.
