A full beach nourishment in North Ponte Vedra Beach, in the form of an engineered beach with a vegetated dune system, would provide increased protection from future storm destruction to private property, recreation opportunities and environmental protection.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Environmental assessment, Borrow Site Survey/ECL, Permitting (State, Federal and Local), Analysis, Design, Planning and Construction.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This Project will provide continued protection of people, property and infrastructure. Continued protection of State Road A1A and Ponte Vedra Blvd, the only evacuation routes for about 6,000 residents on the barrier island. It will also increase tourism and boost the economy.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 200,000 residents and 6 million visitors

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The continued rebuilding of the beaches and dune system will help protect private property, upland infrastructure as well as restore the beach and support vibrant tourism and ensure continued protection from future storms. The success of the project will be measured by property values and tourism revenues.
